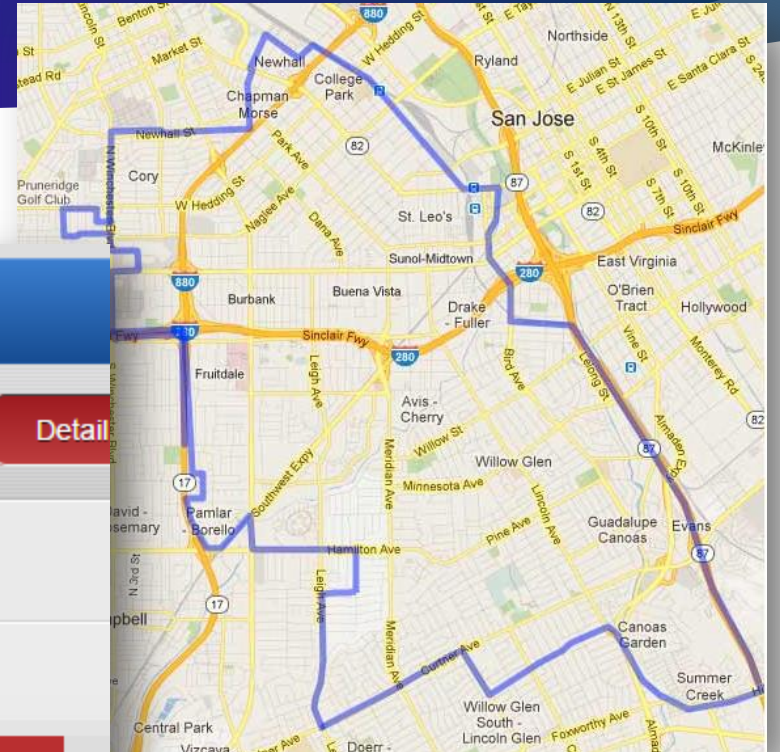

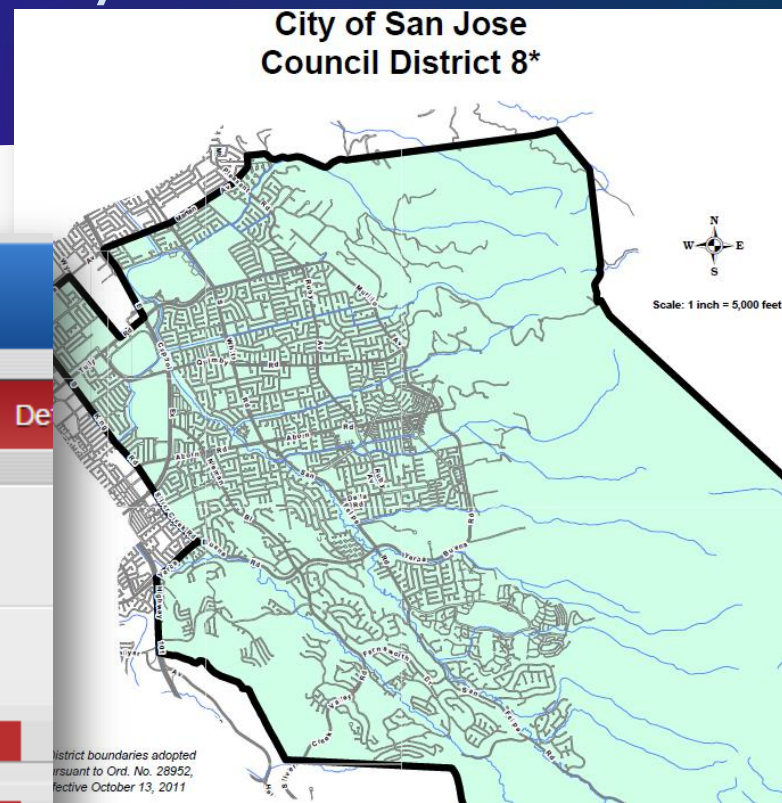

# Measure E

Is a first-in-the-United States mandate on businesses and non-profits that requires these employers to offer additional hours to existing part-time employees before hiring any new employees or outside contractors. It allows anyone to bring action against the employers to enforce this measure, opening the door to an unpredictable number of lawsuits. To defend against these lawsuits, employers will have to implement onerous new recordkeeping processes. Employers had no input into the crafting of this measure and it applies only to employers within San Jose. I will be doing what I can to minimize the effects of this new law on our business community. We are fighting to attract businesses and jobs to San Jose, and we cannot let this new measure destroy our momentum. Measure E passed with close to 64% of the vote.

## Measure G

Is an update to the City of San Jose Business Tax. This “modernization” of the business tax was the first increase in the tax in over 30 years. It raises the base tax from \$150 to \$195, increases rates incrementally for larger businesses, and expands the tax to include those rental property owners who have as few as one rental unit. The measure also creates a new low-income hardship exemption and indexes future tax rates to inflation. More information will be provided in my next newsletter to help you navigate the updated Business Tax. Almost 66% of voters said “Yes” to Measure G.
